


#### **TURN AROUND FACTS**

When faced with an addition problem, you don't always have to begin with the first number. When adding, you can start anywhere to make it easier for yourself!

You can 'Turn Around the Number Facts'.

An easy example is: 2 and 4 more. If I 'Turn Around the Number Facts' to say 4 and 2 more, I put the larger number (4) in my head and count on 2 more.



We can do lots of switching around when there are lots things to add. By switching things around we might be able use other strategies like friends of 10, doubles, near doubles and adding 10.

For example: I have 6 dogs, 8 butterflies, 4 frogs, 5 cats and 2 cows. How many animals are there altogether?

When looking at this problem, I can see lots of Turn Around Facts I can use.

I can add the 6 dogs and 4 frogs-that's 10 so far. (friends of 10)


I can add the 8 butterflies and the 2 cows- that's another 10. (another friends of 10) So now I have 20. (double 10)

I only need to add on the 5 cats and that makes 25 animals altogether. (tens plus 5)

This strategy 'Turn Around the Number Facts' only works for addition (and multiplication)

Why not try this strategy when you are doing your homework or playing a card game!

## Mobile Phone—Settings on your phone

Parents, would you please check your Settings for "Incoming Call restrictions" and "Do Not Disturb" notifications on your mobile phones so as in a case of an

You may not easily recognise the incoming telephone numbers from our school as we have a number of outgoing lines—randomly chosen by the telephone system. Please take this into account if you are not recognising the call number.

#### **Visa Status**

Could you please ensure the school has the most up-to-date paperwork on your child's Visa Status i.e. if his/her status has changed or if your child is now an Australian Citizen or the passport has expired and a new one has been reissued, please contact the school office immediately.

#### **Australian Citizenship Papers**

If parents or students become Australian Citizens at any time during the year, could you please provide the school with a copy of your certificate so we can put it with your child's enrolment forms. This is needed for audit purposes. Thank you.

#### Bicycle Awareness - Keeping the children safe

Dear families, If your child rides a bicycle to school, (with or without supervision), please ensure that you have signed the Bicycle Policy and returned it to school. Please also ensure that the child enters the school using the walkers' gate and not through the carpark entrances or drop off circle. As the weather is getting cooler, please check that your child's clothing has their name on it as there are many items that end up in the Lost Property Bin. Also it would be a good idea to put an extra pair of underwear, socks/stockings in your child's backpack.

#### Have you changed your contact details?

As part of maintaining a safe environment for all students and staff at Good Shepherd School, we conduct regular Emergency Evacuation and Safety Drills. You may have information come home from your child regarding an Evacuation Practice, please be assured in the event of a real emergency all families will be notified at the earliest possible time. #### **Complaints/Grievances Forms**

Parents, please note if you would like to make a complaint/ grievance in regards to any school matter, you can pick up a form from the school office. All matters will be attended to under strict confidentiality.

#### **No Nut Policy**

Dear parents, just a reminder that a number of our students have severe allergies. Please do not send peanut butter/ Nutella sandwiches or other foods containing whole or crushed nuts or sesame seeds to school. This also includes excursions! Your co-operation is greatly appreciated.

#### Child Safety—Protocol regarding discipline

Dear Parents & Carers—just a reminder regarding child safety, please do no not approach children that are not yours, if you have a problem or concern please speak to your child's class teacher or teacher on duty. Also please do not approach the parents of other students if you have an issue at school, rather let the school know and we will deal with any issues that may arise. The following is an insert from the Department of Child Protection: "The NSW Child Protection legislation prohibits any adult from disciplining a child other than their own. This is particularly so when children are at school. Issues should always be brought to the attention of the class teacher, assistant principal or principal." Thank you.

#### **Literacy Tips**



### Reading Aloud: Why so important?

When your child becomes a more independent reader, we often let him or her read on their own and stop reading aloud as often. Its understandable since we want them to practice reading aloud and independently but it's important to remember that reading aloud is important for children of all ages. Even adults enjoy listening to books read aloud on tape. Take turns each night deciding who will read.

When you read aloud to your child you are giving them time to sit and think about what they are listening to without the pressure of sounding out words or making sure they are reading smoothly. Listening to books read aloud also allows children to hear new words they may have difficulty reading on their own. If you want your child involved while you read aloud, be sure to track print and tell them you want to see them watching while you read. Don't forget to ask questions before, during and after reading too!

#### Attendance at School

A major learning and pastoral focus of Good Shepherd each year is making sure that every student is at school every day possible.

As you are probably aware, attendance at school has a huge impact on a student's academic success, starting in kindergarten and continuing through high school. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day - they understand why attendance is so important for success in school and life.

We realise some absences are unavoidable due to health problems or other circumstances. But, we also know that when students miss too much school — regardless of the reason – it can cause them to fall behind academically. Your child is less likely to succeed if he or she is absent. Absences can add up quickly and if a student is absent one day a fortnight over the course of a school year they will miss 20 days of education, which is almost half a school term.

Missing school will negatively impact on your child's learning and results.

We want your child to be successful at school and we know that you do too. If you are having a problem with your child attending school regularly, please let us know. There may be ways we can support you in making sure your child attends school on time every day. Thank you, Mrs Carr and Mrs Cooke.
