School Uniforms and Acceptable Haircuts

We have noticed that some variations have crept in to what the students are wearing to school. Thank you to those families who adhere to our uniform code. Many people comment that our students stand out as well groomed and neat and tidy when we attend various events.

Parents please be aware that our uniform expectations are on the website. I draw your attention particularly to the section on haircuts, shoes and socks and sports shoes.

Acceptable haircuts for Good Shepherd are named. We do not permit lines, shaved sides and long top, or coloured hair. Students should return to school with an appropriate haircut. Shoes from next year are black with white socks for girls and brown socks for boys. These are to be ankle (fold over) not anklette or sport socks.

For sports shoes please choose predominately white shoes not multi coloured or flouro shoes. No bright orange or pink. Uniform notes will be sent home from the beginning of the year to those who don't conform with our uniform policy. 
