Dear Parents and Guardians.

It was very pleasing to hear the kindergarten children at the Easter hat parade being able to tell us why Easter is a time of new life and why we use the symbols of eggs and chickens. Information regarding Leave from School

Leave from school for holiday/overseas trips in school time is not encouraged and must be explained

in writing to the School Principal.

A leave form ("Application for Extended Leave") must be completed at least 4 weeks in advance for 5 or more school days. Leave forms can be obtained from the school administration office. Leave during school terms is strongly discouraged.

Leave of 4 days and less needs to also be approved by the Principal. Please write a letter to your child's class teacher outlining the details of the leave, including the first and last school day that the child will be absent.

In NSW, school attendance is compulsory for children over the age of six years until the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. Students must complete Year 10, and after Year 10 until they turn 17 years of age, students must be: in school or registered for home schooling, or in approved education or training (e.g. TAFE, traineeship, apprenticeship), or in fulltime, paid employment (average 25 hours per week) or in a combination of work, education and/or training.

NAPLAN 2018

The 2018 NAPLAN tests will be conducted over three days from **Tuesday 15th May** - **Thursday 17th May**. For students in Years 3 and 5, there are four tests covering:

- numeracy,
- reading,
- writing and
- language conventions (spelling, punctuation and grammar).

The assessments are an opportunity for students to demonstrate what they have learned in class.

The NAPLAN test results and the student reports are released in September.

The results provide information about student achievement that can be used to inform teaching and learning programs. NAPLAN tests provide point-in-time information regarding student progress in literacy and numeracy and are intended to complement the wide range of formal and informal assessments that are already conducted in schools. NAPLAN test results are not intended to be used in isolation from other school-based assessment programs. Further details will be sent home closer to the date.



Literacy Tips:

Try this fun way to assist your child to join sounds together to make word.

Play the game 'Guess my Word'.

Select words which contain two or three sounds in them and say each sound slowly. Ask your child to guess the word which is made when the sounds are joined together e.g. (s-u-n = sun). Take turns.

PROCLAIM 2018: National Conference on Parish Renewal and Evangelisation 12 – 14 July 2018

The Archdiocese of Brisbane, in collaboration with the ACBC's National Centre for Evangelisation, will host PROCLAIM 2018. This national conference will engage parishes and faith communities in a conversation focusing on five key areas: Leadership, Culture Change, Young People, Belonging and Evangelisation.

During the conference participants can attend keynote presentations, expert panel sessions and discussions facilitated by leaders with 'on the ground' experience. Ideally, this will help those participants to contribute to the formulation of some practical strategies to assist your parish or faith community's own goals in the areas of renewal and evangelisation.
