Dear Parents and Guardians,

Technology has become an important and expected part of how we conduct our everyday lives. We become annoyed if the internet crashes and we expect to have access everywhere. This change has happened over a relatively short space of time but for our children it is the only life they have known. Technology is evolving at a relentless pace and children are usually the first to take up anything that's new, whether it is internet, mobile phones, web cameras, digital cameras or the latest online games. They are often more skilled and informed than their parents and many of us struggle to keep abreast of the latest internet games and social networking sites our children are involved in.

As parents, we might be aware of our children's ability to master new technologies and even be tempted to boast about how "tech-savvy" our children are. However, we all need to be aware that our children are as vulnerable to harm and violence in cyberspace as they are in the physical world. This means that protecting our children in cyberspace is just as important as protecting them in other environments. Just because they are at home inside our house, no longer means that they are safe.

Unsupervised access of the internet can expose our children to materials that are psychologically harmful, to on-line grooming when a child's trust is gained so as to draw them into a situation which could be harmful to them, and to harassment and bullying. With unrestricted access, children can intentionally or unintentionally access pornography that can never really be erased from their mind.

Chat-rooms and instant messenger services allow for users to remain anonymous and so children can be totally unaware of the true identity of a person with whom they might be communicating. Online games engaged in excessively, can inhibit the development of social skills and lessen interest in stimulating activities like reading and sport.

The internet, if correctly supervised, offers children the opportunities of information, education, entertainment and communication with others. Parents need to be fully aware of the content and the amount of time their children spend in pursuing these opportunities. The outcome of these opportunities must be positive and truly developmental for our children, otherwise, we have let them down. We, too, need to be "tech-savvy".

Information regarding Leave from School

Leave from school for holiday/overseas trips in school time is not encouraged and must be explained in writing to the School Principal.

A leave form ("Application for Extended Leave") must be completed at least 4 weeks in advance for 5 or more school days. Leave forms can be obtained from the school administration office. Leave during school terms is strongly discouraged.

Leave of 4 days and less needs to also be approved by the Principal. Please write a letter to your child's class teacher outlining the details of the leave, including the first and last school day that the child will be absent.

In NSW, school attendance is compulsory for children over the age of six years until the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. Students must complete Year 10, and after Year 10 until they turn 17 years of age, students must be: in school or registered for home

schooling, or in approved education or training (e.g. TAFE, traineeship, apprenticeship), or in full-time, paid employment (average 25 hours per week) or in a combination of work, education and/or training.

submit an Enrolment Form for any new siblings for 2019.





ROOT WORD OF THE WEEK



Numeracy Warmup

Times as Many

Learning Intention: We are learning to use mental strategies to solve multiplicative problems.

Success Criteria: I know I am successful when I can;

- create arrays by showing equal rows and columns
- state that rows are horizontal and columns are vertical
- use an array to show times as many
- accurately state the number of objects in rows and columns
- work out the total in the quickest/most efficient way
- work out the total without skip counting all the time
- use known multiplication facts
- use known double facts

Aim: to develop mental strategies for multiplication.

Work in pairs.

Player 1 rolls the dice and takes that many counters and puts them in a row or column and says, e.g. "I have 1 group/row/column of 5 counters".

Player 2 rolls the dice and says, "I need to get 6 times as many as you". Then takes that times as many counters as Player 1 and explains how many rows/groups/columns they have.

Player 1 then finds the total in the most efficient way and explains strategy. Swap roles.

Possible Questions:

- How many rows/columns does you array have?
- What would the number sentence for your array be?
- How many counters would there be if you had e.g. one more row/column?
- What if you array was doubled/halved?

Resources: small household items that are a similar size like buttons, gemstones, pasta shells, rocks or pebbles. You can also use counter or small blocks.

National Apology to Victims and Survivors of Institutional Child Sexual Abuse

A reflection for all the agencies, ministries, parishes, clergy, staff and volunteers of the Diocese of Parramatta for 11am on Monday 22 October 2018

This reflection is to acknowledge and recognise the importance of the National Apology to Victims and Survivors of Institutional Child Sexual Abuse being delivered today by the Prime Minister of Australia, Scott Morrison.

Today is a very important day when the prime minister will say sorry to all those people in Australia who, in the past, were hurt as children in places where they were supposed to be loved and cared for, including our churches and schools.

The prime minister will not only be saying sorry to the people for the hurt they have suffered, but also to acknowledge and recognise their courage in telling their stories.

With their voice, these brave people were able speak out and ask for help. It has meant that many of those who caused the harm have been brought to justice, and other children have been saved from harm. It has also helped us as a Catholic community to learn from the past so that this does not happen again.

The Diocese of Parramatta, including our parishes, schools, ministries, agencies, staff, clergy and volunteers are joining together today to acknowledge the National Apology, to remember the children who were hurt, and to give thanks to those who found courage and strength in speaking out.

We stand together to acknowledge the harm caused by those within Catholic institutions who sexually abused children or responded to abuse in a way that was ineffective or inadequate, and to honour the immense courage of those who found their voice and spoke the truth which saved others from harm.



School Crossing Supervisors – Work with your community 2 x Casual Position – Blacktown Local Government Area (00006K61)

An important person in a child's school life is the School Crossing Supervisor, who ensures they cross the road safely. The role requires minimal hours out of your day and gives something worthwhile back to the community.

The hours are usually 8.00am to 9.30am and/or 2.30pm to 4.00pm Monday to Friday during school terms. You may be required to work morning, afternoon, both shifts and no shifts. As a casual you will be filling in for existing part-time staff as required. The base rate is \$23.02 - \$27.62 per hour.

All the qualifications you need are community spirit, good communication skills, an alert and professional attitude to work and a reliable personality. The casual hours and school holidays would suit a parent or grandparent, a retiree or anyone wanting meaningful work — but not full-time.

Training for your key responsibilities of directing traffic to stop at the designated crossing and giving clear instructions to infants and primary school students to cross the road safely, will be provided. You may be required to attend a health assessment. Appointment is subject to a Working with Children Check clearance.
