
Information regarding Leave from School

If leave is **10 days or more**, an interview with the Principal is also required, together with an Application for Extended Leave form. Leave forms can be obtained from the School Office.

Leave of 4 days and less needs to also be approved by the Principal. Please write a letter to your child's class teacher outlining the details of the leave, including the first and last school day that the child will be absent.

Is my child too ill to attend school?

What signs should I watch for to see if my child should stay home from school? Sick children who are lethargic or whiny are often giving clues that they require rest at home to recuperate. Other possible signs of illness are fever, uncontrolled coughing, difficulty breathing, wheezing or persistent crying. Did the doctor diagnose a contagious illness that should keep your child at home? In this case, your child should remain at home until the risk of passing on the illness has passed. When can my child return to school?

As long as there is no fever or discomfort, a child with a cold may go to school, as long as they are not too uncomfortable to function in school. Instruct the child on the proper use of tissues for coughing, sneezing, and nose

blowing. They should also be taught good handwashing techniques, since research has shown that more colds are spread via contaminated hands than by infected droplets in the

be forwarded to the class teacher on the day of your child's return to school. Prolonged absences from school due to illness should be supported by a medical certificate.


Winter Uniform

Attendance at School

Attendance at school has a vital and measurable impact upon our children's learning. The data supporting this is reflected in the CEDP attendance campaign title "Every Day Counts". Statistically, students taking more than 10 days off per year are at risk of a measurable, detrimental impact on their learning and success. Please be aware of the number of days your child is missing from school, and work with us in the development of strategies to support you being able to get your child to school each day. Together we can ensure that they have every possible opportunity for success.

Pros and cons of NAPLAN

MAY is NAPLAN month in schools. It's a time when NAPLAN workbooks and 'how to' guides take centre stage in bookstores, coaching clinics attract more students and anxiety begins to build among parents and students.

It's also a time when schools and school systems feel like their work comes under the microscope.

Then there's the long wait between tests and the release of results when everyone hopes there has been student and school improvement.

Like many in education, I continue to ask myself how a test that was intended to measure a

student's progress in reading, writing, grammar and numeracy at a nominated moment in time could generate such heated debate. None of this can be healthy, particularly for students about to sit the tests.

When I was teaching, we had the Basic Skills Test (BST) in NSW, which provided a snapshot of a student's progress in literacy and numeracy. The BST was low-key and never used to compare students, teachers or schools. There was general agreement that the BST provided useful feedback for teachers in the areas for improvement or intervention.

Unfortunately, the publication of NAPLAN results and the use of these results to make blunt comparisons has created more fear than understanding. Any standardised test must be viewed in the context of each learning community and reviewed in terms of its reliability. It is only one tool and it isn't the only tool for identifying where there are gaps in student learning.

While NAPLAN's future is unclear, I think it is vital that schools continue to have a clear understanding of how each child is progressing.

Whatever may follow from NAPLAN needs to harness the power of today's technologies to allow teachers to be able to access data and track student progress in real time in order to make better and faster decisions that lead to improved learning.



BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS!

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care.

We realise that many of our dedicated volunteers have already completed a Working with Children Check. Thank you for the providing this information to our school, however, this new requirement is in addition to the current WWCC/APP number that you have provided.

If you are **new** to volunteering to the school, or you have **already completed** your clearance, please follow the procedures below to complete the online forms.

It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

• Volunteers – please click on '<u>Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers</u>' or access the form via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).



Then click on 'Volunteer Form' (halfway down page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are volunteering. Thank you for assisting us in keeping our children and community safe.
