So, how many pieces of Fruit or Veggies have you been eating? How is your class tally going?


We all know how important a good diet is and eating fruit and veggies each day helps us to stay happy and healthy. You should be eating 5 serves of veggies and 2 serves of

Information regarding Leave from School

A leave form ("Application for Extended Leave") must be completed at least 4 weeks in advance for 5 or more school days. If leave is 10 days or more, an interview with the Principal is also required, together with an Application for Extended Leave form. Leave forms can be obtained from the School Office.

Leave of 4 days and less needs to also be approved by the Principal. Please write a letter to your child's class teacher outlining the details of the leave, including the first and last school day that the child will be absent.

Leave during school terms is strongly discouraged.

Uniform Shop

Is my child too ill to attend school?

What signs should I watch for to see if my child should stay home from school? Sick children who are lethargic or whiny are often giving clues that they require rest at home to recuperate. Other possible signs of illness are fever, uncontrolled coughing, difficulty breathing, wheezing or persistent crying. Did the doctor diagnose a contagious illness that should keep your child at home? In this case, your child should remain at home until the risk of passing on the illness has passed. When can my child return to school?

As long as there is no fever or discomfort, a child with a cold may go to school, as long as they are not too uncomfortable to function in school. Instruct the child on the proper use of tissues for coughing, sneezing, and nose blowing. They should also be taught good hand-washing techniques, since research has shown that more colds are spread via contaminated hands than by infected droplets in the air.

Children Absent from School

In the event of your child being absent from school due to illness, please inform the school office by phone or email. It is necessary that a written note of explanation be forwarded to the class teacher

on the day of your child's return to school. Prolonged absences from school due to illness should be supported by a medical certificate.

Road Safety Reminders

With the start of the school term it is a good time to remind everyone to take care on the road. Here are a few pointers:

Remind your children STOP, Look and Listen and Think before they step out on the road. This includes on pedestrian crossings and at traffic lights.

· Anyone riding a bike or a scooter needs to wear a helmet and make sure that it is fastened firmly. This will reduce the injuries to their head if they fall off.

Make sure that everyone is buckled up in the car. Our local highway patrol report that many children are not buckled into in the correct car seats or the seats are not strapped into the car correctly. For more information or to find out about car seat checking events contact the Road Safety Officer at Blacktown Council.




IFM Reflective Ministry Program: 20 August

Good Shepherd Primary Bicycle/ Scooter Policy 2018/2019

- The Catholic Education Office and the NSW Roads and Traffic Authority recommends that children under 10 years of age DO NOT ride bicycles/scooters to or from school unless accompanied by an adult.
- 2. Children must always correctly wear a Standards Australia approved bicycle helmet when in control of a bicycle or scooter.
- 3. All RMS road rules concerning bicycle and scooters are to be followed. This includes the pedestrian right of way on footpaths. The bell should be used as a warning when approaching pedestrians, or a verbal announcement as to the approach of the bicycle /scooter.
- 4. Bicycles and scooters ridden to school must be in good, safe working order and bicycles must be fitted with a bell. It is the responsibility of the parent/carer to ensure that the bicycle/scooter is in good and safe working order and that all protective equipment as required by law is provided.
- 5. Bicycle/scooter riders are expected to use the available pedestrian entry points.
- 6. Children are to dismount before entering the school grounds and walk their wheeled devices whilst on site.
- 7. Bicycles are to be stored in the bike rack provided. Bicycles must be locked with a chain and padlock supplied by the bicycle owner.
- 8. Bicycles scooters and helmets are brought to school and stored on school grounds at the owner's risk.
- 9. Parents will be notified if children do not adhere to the School's Bicycle/ Safety Policy.
- 10. No riding of bicycles, scooters, roller blades or skateboards are permitted in school grounds during school hours or after hours.
