## Year 3 Excursion to Gibberagong National Park

*"On Wednesday, the 6th November 3R and 3W went to a fun park called Gibberagong National Park. I was excited to see everything there. Our tour guide was named David."*

*Our travelling to the place took sooooo long. When we arrived everyone got crazy. The thing we looked at was the centre where we saw some prehistorical creatures and some other animals too. But I loved feeling the snake skin! After we did that we got out in the environment. The first thing we learnt about was how the brush turkey made its nest and where it laid its eggs. After that we did crab watching but you had to be very silent and not make a sound! Going to Gibberagong was a good experience. I'd really love to go there again with my family. *After recess we also went to go see trees that have holes and the holes in the trees are a nest for owls. Before lunch we saw a tree with charcoal on it so we put it on our face for a disguise. On our way down we saw leaves that have medicine in it and what you do is you fold it a couple of times, then roll it onto a ball then smell it. After we ate our lunch we sketched out five different kinds of plants.*

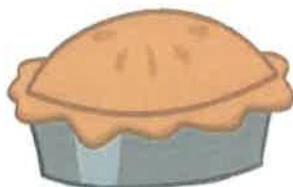

### Back to School 2020

Parents, if you intend travelling overseas or interstate during the **Christmas holidays** and your child/children will be **returning to school after school resumes**, would you please notify the office in writing that this will be happening and note the date your child will be returning for the 2020 school year. (NB, please remember you require an interview with the Principal for leave of 10 school days or more **prior to taking leave**. You will need to complete an Application for Extended Leave form which can be picked up from the school office). **This must be completed, travel documentation attached to it, and returned to the school office prior to going on leave.** An interview will then be arranged with the Principal in order for leave to be approved.



### Class Placement for 2020

Very soon we will start to formulate classes for 2020. If you have any issues regarding your child's class placement, please inform Mrs Patricia Carr, Principal, in writing no later than **Friday, 22nd November**. Whilst we endeavour to take into account your considerations, final decisions are made by the School.

If your family is not returning to Good Shepherd in 2020, would you please let Mrs Carr know in writing by **Friday, 22nd November**. Please indicate the school that they will be attending for our records. Thank you.

### Child Safety—Protocol regarding discipline

Dear Parents & Carers—just a reminder regarding child safety, please do not approach children who are not yours. If you have a problem or concern, please speak to your child's class teacher or teacher on duty. Also please do not approach the parents of other students if you have an issue at school, rather let the school know and we will deal with any issues that may arise.

The following is an insert from the Department of Child Protection: "The NSW Child Protection legislation prohibits any adult from disciplining a child other than their own. This is particularly so when children are at school. Issues should always be brought to the attention of the class teacher, assistant principal or principal." Thank you.

### 40 km/h School Zones

The 40 km/h school zone slows traffic in the vicinity of the school. Most 40 km/h school zones operate between 8.00 am and 9.30 am and from 2.30 pm until 4.00 pm. **The 40 km/h school zone speed limit must be observed even if school children cannot be seen.**

### Car Park Safety

Parents, please be aware that all children **MUST** be escorted into the School premises, not let out of the car and left to walk alone through the car park. Also, please show a little courtesy when entering and leaving the car park. Reverse parking is designed for everyone's safety, please comply. Thank you.



### Excursion/Incursion Notes

Please keep these notes in a safe place when your child/ren bring them home. The office Staff are frequently being asked for another note and this uses extra paper and resources that should be utilised elsewhere in our school. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

### No Nut Policy

A number of our students have severe allergies. Please do not send peanut butter/Nutella sandwiches or other foods containing whole or crushed nuts or sesame seeds to school. This also includes Excursions! Your co-operation is greatly appreciated.

### Lost Property tub is overflowing !!

Dear Parents, please take the time to go through the lost property tub as there are many items of clothing that may be your child's! The lost property tub is located in the foyer section of the school office.



### After School Supervision

Just a reminder that school finishes at 2:50 pm. Please ensure that your children have been collected **before 3:15 pm each afternoon**.

There are many children who have not been collected before 3:15pm which creates issues with supervision & safety for the children. If you are late collecting your children from school it impacts on the children, the staff and the running of the school. Please ensure that you have made suitable arrangements to have your children collected by 3:15 pm.

If there is an emergency and you are running late to collect the children, please telephone the school office on (02) 9836 7100. Thank you.

### Evacuation & Lockdown Practices

Each term our school practices either a Lockdown or an Evacuation. This is part of our keeping the children and our whole community safe. There is no need for alarm if your child comes home with stories of "an emergency". We do use the sirens to make the drill realistic. Be assured if ever there is a reason for a Lockdown or Evacuation, all staff are trained and ready.

**Please make sure you regularly update your telephone and emergency contact details. If your mobile phone settings are "incoming call restricted" please change these settings so that we can reach you, in the event of an emergency.** Thank you.

### Uploading of Photos onto YouTube and Social Media

Parents, please note there is to be no uploading of pictures of students that are not your own child, onto YouTube and Social Media eg Facebook, Instagram etc. from events at school without prior permission from the School Principal. Such events include school functions, excursions, liturgies etc.



### Contact Details

Parents, it is vital that all contact information including phone/mobile numbers, emergency contacts, home address, email address are kept up to date. **Please contact the School Office if any changes need to be made.** Also if you purchase a new mobile phone, don't forget to download the Skoolbag App as this is an important tool for communication purposes. Thank you.



### Changing Schools in 2020?

Are you thinking of or needing to change schools in 2020? Whatever the reason, we would appreciate you letting us know as soon as you can. CEDP require us to estimate our enrolment numbers for 2020 in order to predict and prepare for appropriate staffing and budgeting. **It would be appreciated if you could notify the school in writing if your child/ren may be leaving Good Shepherd at the end of the year, from Year groups other than Year 6.**

### Student Absences

Dear Parents,  
Just a quick reminder that **ALL student absences need to be explained. This is a legal requirement.**

#### Unexplained Attendance letters

Your child may bring home a letter asking for an explanation for your child's absence from school. **Would you please complete and return back to your child's teacher promptly.**

#### Children Absent from School due to illness

In the event of your child being absent from school due to illness, **please inform the school office by phone or email. It is necessary that a written note of explanation be forwarded to the class teacher on the day of your child's return to school.** We need to receive this note within seven days of the last day of absence. Prolonged absences from school due to illness should be supported by a medical certificate.



### School Commencement and Finishing Times

**School commences at 8.30 am and concludes at 2.50 pm.** Any child who arrives after this time or leaves school earlier for an appointment etc will need to report to the School Office. It is very important that your child arrive to school on time. Children arriving late to school miss out on valuable learning time and their late entry to the classroom disrupts their fellow students. **If your children are late to school, they are to be escorted to the School Office by a Parent/Carer.**

### School Hats

Please remember our "No Hat, No Play" policy and ensure that your child has their school hat each day. All clothing and hats should be clearly labelled with your child's name and class. Thank you.



### Term 4 2019 Staff Development Days (Pupil Free Days)

Each year Staff participate in professional development to support them in their roles as educators. The focus of these days is aligned to Good Shepherd School's goals. Staff will use information they have gathered about the children to design learning programs for the children that will best meet their needs. **Term 4's Staff Development Days are Pupil Free Days and will take place on Thursday 19th December and Friday 20th December.** Our thanks to parents for organising care for their children on this day.

**COSHC will be unable to offer spaces for care on these days.**

### Student Mobile Phones

Parents, please note students are not allowed to have mobiles on their person or in the backpack during school hours. If you need to contact them, please ring the School Office. Students can leave their mobile phones with the office in the morning and collect them at dismissal time. Thank you.

### Complaints/Grievances Forms

Parents, please note if you would like to make a complaint/grievance in regards to any school matter, you can pick up a form from the school office. All matters will be attended to under strict confidentiality.

### Stewardship of School Resources

Each year, the school allocates a fairly substantial budget to the Resource Centre so new and exciting books can be purchased for the children to borrow. All members of the school community are responsible for the care of these resources. Unfortunately, each month a number of books come back to school damaged—scribbled on, with drink bottles spills, pages cut out of them etc. It is disappointing that many children return these books without notifying the Resource Centre that they are damaged. It is important for the children to learn responsibility for these resources. Damaged books need to be replaced and families are responsible for the replacement costs if books are damaged whilst in their care. We understand that accidents sometimes happen but it is important that the children realise the importance of honesty. Please notify the Resource Centre when returning damaged books.

This policy is **effective immediately**. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
