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KINDERGARTEN GRADE LETTER TERM 1 2019

WE WARMLY WELCOME ALL OF YOU TO OUR WONDERFUL SCHOOL!

We hope that you are starting to feel a part of the place and have made a few new friends (parents as well as students!)

Please take the time to read this newsletter as it has information pertinent to Kindergarten and it might answer some questions you may have.

The school gates open at 8:00am and **supervision begins at 8:10am**. All children and family members are to sit in the COLA (steps) until duty begins (8:10am). **Teachers will tell you when you can leave the area**. Please ensure that your child is wearing their hat.

Your child's bag can be placed on a hook outside the classrooms. As there are not enough hooks for every child, some bags will be kept inside the classrooms once the school day begins.

We encourage the children to place their own bags on the hooks so that they can find them easily throughout the course of the day. Please also make sure that your child is able to identify their own bag by letting them choose either a tag or coloured ribbon that will help them to identify their school bag.

A school hat is essential- it is needed everyday! Please also ensure that your child has a change of clothes in their bag as accidents do happen.

Label everything! It is very easy for things to get lost or misplaced.

School begins at 8:30am promptly. When the music goes at 8:25am, the children line up outside their rooms and have their lunch boxes with them, ready to take them inside the room to keep cool. Their hat goes into their bag.

Do not pack too much food for your child; they will not eat it all. Please pack a drink bottle filled with water.

Please say goodbye to your child before they line up with their class and remember, **a quick goodbye is a good goodbye**. When you say goodbye, remind your child that you will be back to pick them up (or remind them of the alternative pick up arrangements).

The first two weeks your child comes to school (31st January-8th February), you can pick up your Kindergarten child from 2:30pm. Other siblings cannot be picked up early. They still finish at 2:50pm. Your child finishes at 2:50pm from Monday 11th February.

At the end of the day, the children can be picked up from the classroom for the first 5 minutes. After this time, they are escorted to the COLA and supervised by the duty teacher till 3:15pm. All children **MUST** be picked up by this time.

When picking up your child from the classroom, **please do not crowd the door**. It makes it difficult for children to leave the room and actually causes anxiety with so many adults in one space. Please stand behind the marked out areas and the teacher will dismiss the children one at a time to a waiting adult. This will be slow for the first couple of weeks (and take us longer than 5 minutes) as we get to know your faces and who belongs with whom. Please be patient with us!

Please check your child's bag daily when you get home. There are often important notes for you.

PE Uniform is to be worn on the following days:

Tuesday- All of Kinder

Wednesday- KB and KG

Friday- KR and KW

Library Borrowing will begin shortly. Please ensure that your child has a library bag to place the books in that they wish to borrow. Borrowing days will be Mondays for all Kinder classes.

A MEET THE TEACHER BBQ will be held on Wednesday 13th February 2019 from 4:30-6:30pm. Come along and enjoy a beef sausage sizzle and have a chat with your child's class teacher. All of the family are welcome. Please return the RSVP from the flyer that was sent home for catering purposes.

The teachers are very busy each morning and afternoon so if you need to have a chat, please arrange for a meeting time through the office. If you don't have the time to meet face to face, the class teacher can always ring you. Just contact the office for assistance.

Make sure you have signed up for the **free app for your phone**.

It is called **skoolbag**. Search for our school in the app store and join. It's that simple! You will receive the weekly school

newsletter LINK as well as any messages that are sent out. You can also have a look at the school website and have the LINK emailed to you each Tuesday. There are lots of other things on the website too.



Attendance at school is critical to ensure success at school. We understand that children sometimes get sick and should be kept home, though keep in mind that the more days a

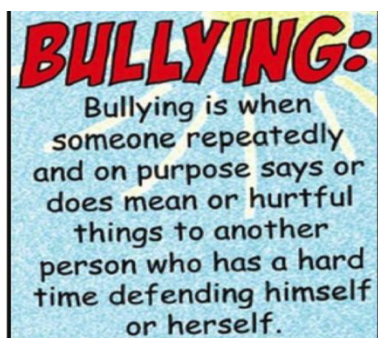
child has away from school, the greater the negative impact this has on his/her learning. If your child is genuinely sick, please ring the office after 9am and let us know. A short letter explaining the reason for your child's absence is required the day he/she returns to school. This is given to the class teacher.

If you are late to school, you will need to sign your child in through the office.

If you need to pick up your child early, you will need to go to the office and sign your child out. We do not encourage early pickups. Please restrict them to emergencies only.

Thank you for presenting your child so beautifully in their school uniform. A reminder that suitable haircuts are an important part of our school uniform. Please refer to the LINK, the Parent Handbook or the website for details if you are unsure of our expectations.

We will be testing each child individually in Literacy and Numeracy skills using an assessment called **Best Start**. Best Start is a Kindergarten only assessment that is used extensively throughout all schools in NSW. The purpose of these assessments is to see exactly what skills your child already has and how best we can cater our teaching to their learning needs. There is no pass or fail and in fact, no marks are given! At the conclusion of the assessments you will receive a printed report outlining your child's strengths in Literacy and Numeracy. If you wish to speak to your child's class teacher about the report, this can be arranged.



Sometimes as parents we get upset when our child has a disagreement with another student and we think it is bullying. Bullying is ongoing and persistent, not a single incident. We encourage your child to talk to the duty teacher to resolve a problem. If you have any concerns, please speak to the class teacher. You are **NEVER** permitted to approach a child that is not your own (or their parents).
